Died Friday, May 26, 2017 at the Delmar Gardens South, St. Louis, MO. Allen was inducted into the U.S. Marine Corps 18 December 1944 and was honorably discharged 24 October 1946.

He was a participant in the occupation of China from 11 February 1946 to August 1948 in the intelligence unit. He graduated from Washington University with a degree in Business and a degree in Computer Science.

He worked for Boeing Aircraft Corp for 43 years. He was a deacon in the Parker Road Baptist Church.

Born August 27, 1926 in Lemay, MO. He was the eldest son of Maude Mizell (Patrick) Mesplay and Abe Patrick. He was married to Leota Callie (Woolard) for 58 years who died December 26, 2008.
