



Dean Sheldon Lytle

June 9, 1934 - September 24, 2015

Dean Sheldon Lytle, 81, Born June 9, 1934 to Virgil and Lucille Lytle in Gary South Dakota, passed away at his home on Thursday, Sept 24, 2015. He is survived by his wife of 14 years, Judith Williams, his children Kerry D. (Liesl) and Julie Ann Lytle; grandchildren Jim and Jessi Lytle; Sister Jean (Robert) DeGier; brothers Roger (Dianne) Lytle and Steve (Jeanette) Lytle; step-children Merle (Karen) Williams, Tim (Lisa) Williams and Lynda (Bill) Terranova; step-grandchildren Ashley, Justin, Dylan and Jack Williams, Bob and Nick Terranova.

Dean grew up on a farm in Minnesota and after high school joined the Marines followed by college at South Dakota State where he earned a B.A. in Education and Masters degree in counseling. He taught school in Minnesota for 4 years then left teaching to join the FBI.

He was involved in the JFK investigation of Lee Harvey Oswald in New Orleans and civil rights cases in Mississippi and Louisiana. He was part of the team that discovered the burned vehicle of the three subjects in the Mississippi Burning case. He testified in 1969 and again in 2005 in the case of Mississippi vs Edgar Ray Killen, who was eventually convicted. In 1967, he was reassigned to truck highjacking investigations. This led him into the trucking business where he found his niche as a terminal manager and he retired from that business in 2000. Dean enjoyed fishing in Minnesota and Canada, traveling and life as a snowbird in Florida.
