When Dad was home he liked to spend time with all of us. It was a common occurrence for the neighbor kids to come over and ask if he could "come out and play."

Church was very important to Dad; whether it was teaching Sunday School, singing in the choir or helping out with the church upkeep, Dad was always very active. He used to play on the church bowling league and softball team. Dad loved playing cards, especially pinochle. Sailing was always a fun thing for us to do.

He always golfed on Saturday at Cloverleaf Golf Course in Alton. He hated to stop when he had his stroke. He even took our German Shepherd with him and she knew to not go on the greens. Most of the fellow golfers knew the dogs name but not my Dad's name.

We always knew to never call when Dad was watching Wheel of Fortune or the Cardinals; his favorite past times.

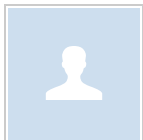
