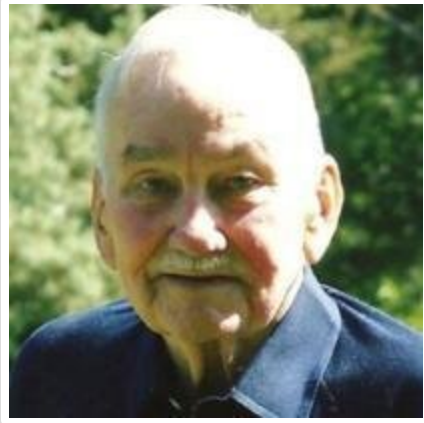




John Paul Shadrach
